Welcome to our fourth annual report! We are pleased to announce that we have added three additional board members, Helen Rynaski, Jennifer Ammann and Colleen Shaughnessy. Unfortunately, as mentioned in our last report we are still navigating the COVID-19 pandemic. However, we opened up in-person service requests in the last year with precautions.

We are back to pre-pandemic service request fulfillments and have noticed an increase in transport service requests. We are actively working to recruit more Volunteers to meet the need of our community. The Board of Directors is acutely aware of the need for Volunteers—the lifeblood of TENT—and is making every effort to ensure that service requests are fulfilled within reason.

We were able to deposit surplus funds over our reserve operating budget with Taos Community Foundation in an investment account that will create lasting sustainability to the organization. We also plan to begin looking for our own office space that can be used as an office and meeting space for Volunteers and Members. We have been able to earmark a couple of grants for this purpose. Despite the pandemic, TENT finds itself in a more sustainable situation than we were in prior to COVID-19 and is actively working to ensure that the needs of the community are met according to our mission and vision.

We currently have 55 TENT Members. Membership remained steady during the pandemic.



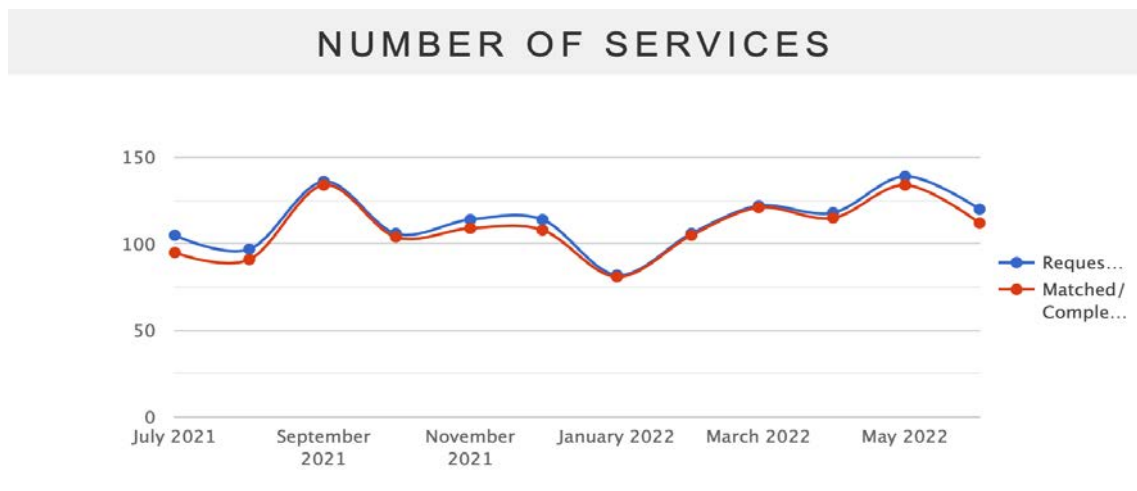

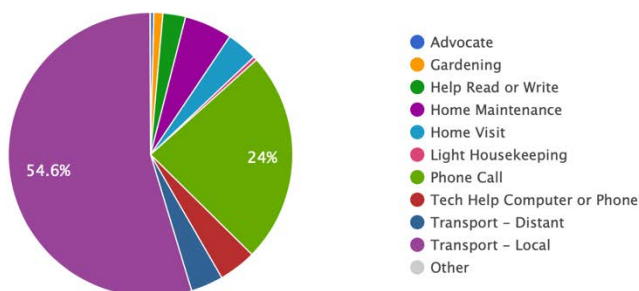
Volunteer Service Activity

We have 57 TENT active Volunteers who have performed 5,369 hours of service in 2021. From 1 July 2021 to 1 July 2022 our Members requested 1,570 services, which took Volunteers 1,550 hours to complete. Our top Volunteer gave 140 hours and drove 1,760 miles. The two neediest Members received 1,400 miles and 150 hours of services. The number of services also varied.

SERVICES COMPLETED BREAKDOWN



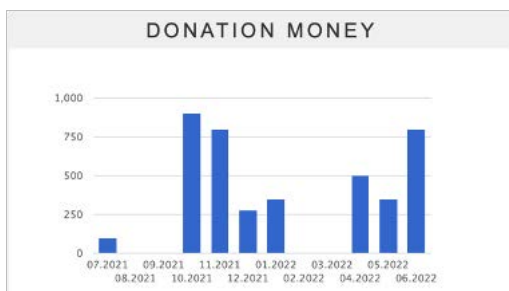
